

With Geophysical Work Completed, Drilling Begun In March, And Currently On Their Second Hole At Their Samapleu Nickel/Copper Project In Mining Friendly Côte d'Ivoire, West Africa - With \$1.2 Million In The Bank, Landen Capital Corp. Will Complete It's First Phase Drilling At Samapleu And Will Investigate Their Arizona Property Via A 3D Model

BIO:

Dr. Audet joined Falconbridge in 1986 after graduating with a degree in Geology from Laval University in Quebec City. Dr. Audet also has a M.Sc. from the University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, RSA and a Ph.D. with both; the Université du Québec à Montréal and the Université de la Nouvelle-Calédonie.

During his career, he specialized in Project Management in foreign countries as well as in Mineral Resource and Mineral Reserve estimations and reporting. He has been actively involved in exploration

projects for Falconbridge/Xstrata Nickel in Canada, Africa, South-America and in Caribbean.

In 2009, Dr Audet continued his career as Consulting Geologist offering expertise in implementation and management of greenfields and early development-stage projects, offering eighteen years of experience in geostatistics and block modelling, with emphasis on Mineral Resource estimation and mine planning.

As of March 29, 2010, Dr Audet became President and CEO of Landen Capital Corp.

Landen Capital Corp. is an emerging junior company, focused on the exploration, development, and acquisition of Nickel-Copper properties as well as Nickel-Cobalt-Scandium rich laterite deposits in North America and Africa.

Company Profile:

Landen Capital Corp. is a Canada-based company. On November 17, 2009, the Company completed its qualifying transaction, whereby it was granted the right to acquire 100% of the Bonanza Property from Terraco Gold Corp. (Terraco).

On December 21, 2009, announce that it has entered into an agreement to acquire 100% of the issued and outstanding shares of SAMA Nickel Corporation. SAMA Nickel Corporation has a joint venture of the Samapleu Nickel-Copper Project in Côte d'Ivoire, West Africa with Société pour le Développement Minier de la Côte d'Ivoire ("SODEMI").

The Samapleu Nickel/Copper Project

encompasses approximately 775 square kilometers and is located 600 kilometers northwest of Abidjan and 50 kilometers west of Biankouma. The deposit was discovered by SODEMI in the mid 1970's. The geological setting consists of well preserved pyroxenitic to peridotitic bodies of early Proterozoic age intrusions within a Charnockitic environment. SODEMI drilled a total of approximately 40 core boreholes during the 70's and 80's as well as in 1996. According to historical data, the best Ni intersection for the whole deposit is in drill hole S2 where 136m of highly disseminated to massive sulphides returned 0.65% Ni and 0.60% Cu at a cut-off of 0.25% Ni (including 3.98% Ni and 3.54% Cu over 7.00m). The historical data has not been reviewed by an independent Qualified Person as required by National Instrument 43-101 regulations.

CEOCFO: Dr. Audet, what is the focus of the company today?

Dr. Audet: The focus of the company is to explore and develop our nickel property in Côte d'Ivoire. The project is called the Samapleu Project and it is a nickel/copper project. We also have a Gold project in Arizona called Bonanza Gold. Bonanza Gold project is located 100 kilometers west of Phoenix, Arizona. These two projects are worked simultaneously.

CEOCFO: Why do you like the nickel/copper project?

Dr. Audet: This project is very interesting as it is located in a new area as far as exploration is concerned. The nickel/copper project was actually discovered in 1980, by the economic arm of the government of Côte d'Ivoire called SO-DEMI. Sodemi drilled the deposit in the 1980's and the 1990's, and they came up with interesting results at that time. The project remained dormant for many years until last year when we re-evaluated the potential and resumed exploration at the project. We have a joint venture with SODEMI on which we are the operator, and as such, we were very busy in the field in 2009 performing IP and ground mag geophysics. We outlined several very interesting anomalies at the main occurrence but also in its vicinity.

CEOFCO: What is it like working in Africa?

Dr. Audet: The project is in the northern part of Côte d'Ivoire, about 600 kilometers from Abidjan, despite the distance, it is easy to work there. Côte d'Ivoire has a road good network and communication system. People are very receptive to the project; it is an area that I worked before for about four years in 1994-1998. At that time, I was the Director of Exploration for Falconbridge. I was managing the exploration works for the nearby property called Sipilou. The Sipilou property includes several nickel-cobalt rich laterites. So I do know Côte d'Ivoire quite well and I enjoy working with the Ivorian. Côte d'Ivoire is a jurisdiction that is actually easy to work in as well as to be able to develop mining projects.

CEOFCO: What is happening on the ground today?

Dr. Audet: We have completed our geophysical works over targets that we identified and we are currently drilling. As we speak, we are on our second hole. We are expecting to complete 3000 meters by May 2010. Then, we will proceed with

some down-hole geophysics to help chasing down the best-mineralized sections and then we will probably follow with more drilling as the results will justify.

CEOFCO: Is there a lot of interest in nickel in the market today?

Dr. Audet: The market seems to be interested with nickel. If you look at nickel prices today it is almost \$11 a pound, which is the highest value for nickel in about two years ago. So, yes, the interest in nickel is growing.

CEOFCO: Would you tell us about your gold project?

Dr. Audet: Our gold project in Arizona is an old producing mine with few underground levels. It produced about 120,000 ounces of gold during his thirty years or

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so operation from the late 1890 to 1929. There are two old mines on the property that we now investigating. The project has been drilled by several companies in the past forty years. Lately, in 2005, an additional seven core boreholes were drilled. It is our intention to create a 3D model that will allow us to focus and properly evaluate the potential of the entire property.

CEOFCO: Do you own that project 100% or is it a joint venture?

Dr. Audet: It is not yet entirely owned by Landen. We have an agreement with Terraco Gold Corp., current owner of the property, under which we can acquire 100% of the property by spending about \$1.2 million.

CEOFCO: What is the financial picture like at Landen today?

Dr. Audet: Right now, we have just completed a private placement of 6 million shares that gives us over \$1.2 million in the bank. That will allow us to complete our first round of exploration at the Samapleu project as well as completing the current phase at Bonanza. Then we will probably raise some more.

CEOFCO: Are you looking at any additional projects?

Dr. Audet: We are always looking for additional projects. This is something that we keep an eye on for sure.

CEOFCO: Is the investment community paying attention to Landen Capital?

Dr. Audet: Yes, definitely the investment community is paying attention to Landen at this moment. You just have to look at the share price of Landen, it went up to .40 cents yesterday, and so yes, the financial community is paying attention to what we are doing.

CEOFCO: In closing, there are many companies to choose from in your industry, why should investor pick Landen Capital out of the crowd?

Dr. Audet: We do have a management team that has extremely good experience in the nickel business. Personally, I have 25 years experience in the nickel and gold as well as in resource estimation in general. I was director of exploration for nickel Laterite worldwide for Xstrata and Falconbridge. I spent many years in Africa and in New-Caledonia, so I know what it look and it need to work in an oversea jurisdiction. And of course, because we do have an extremely good project in Côte d'Ivoire with excellent potential.
